South African Satyagraha, Tolstoy's influence on Gandhi, Tolstoy Farm established by Gandhi as a community for Satyagrahis and their families to work and support themselves, 1000 acres of land purchased near Johannesburg by Kallenbach, joint cultivation on entire agricultural land and housing construction sites erected by the settlers, Common practices of cooking, scavenging, dietetic experiments, multi religious observances, co-education etc., Principles of Industry, Economy, Self sufficiency practised in Tolstoy Farm,

### Unit –IV Ashrams in India Sabarmati Ashram (1915)

Gandhi's return to India in 1915 on permanent basis, Initial stay at Kochrab Bunglow, Ashram relocated on 36 acres of land the banks of Sabarmati river, epicenter of India's freedom struggle, activities of farming, animal husbandary, cow breeding ,khadi etc.Dandi March,present status.

### Sewagram Ashram 1936

After DandiMarch, Gandhi decided not to return to Sabarmati Ashram, Efforts of Vinoba in establishment of Sewagram Ashram, Gandhi's residence from 1936, Gandhi directed Independence movement from Sewagram, model community with simple life and self reliance.

### Unit- I Champaran Satyagraha (1917)

Gandhi introduced to problems of peasants of Champaran in the Lukhnow Congress session Teen Kanthiya system, Gandhi's visit to Champaran, refused to follow the order to leave the place appeared for the trial before the magistrate, thousands of peasants gathered to support Gandhi, freed to proceed, Commission formed with Gandhi as a member, System abolished, Gandhi's associates, Constructive work.

### Unit – II Ahmedabad Mill Workers Strike (1918)

Plague epidemic situations, special bonus granted to workers, issue of withdraw of bonus brought before Gandhi, arbitration unsuccessful, Gandhi's demand of 35% increase in D.A rejected, Gandhi advised nonviolent strike, Gandhi's decision to fast, On settlement Gandhi broke his fast, Gandhi;s associates.

### Unit –III Kheda Satyagraha (1918)

Failure of crop yield in 1918 in Kheda district in Gujarat ,peasants request for exemption of taxes for the year rejected, Gandhi advised Patidars of the area to resort to Satyagraha, Vallabh bhai Patel joined Satyagraha struggle,Pledge for Satygrahis, overcoming the fear of the officials, officers sold cultivators cattle and attached the crops,Onion thief, Government stopped attachments and notices,partial success,contact of educated public workers with actual life of peasants.

### Unit –IV Rowlatt Act Satyagraha (1919)

First nation wide movement, Rowlatt Act framed against sedition, Bill passed inspite of protests from all sections of people, Gandhi announced Satyagraha against the Bill, Satyagraha Sabha formed, Hartal of 24 hours against Rowlatt Act, processions and selling of prohibited literature, martial law imposed in Ahmedabad, Lahore, Amritsar, Jalianwala Baug massacre, Gandhi suspended Civil Disobedience movement.
