The Post Graduate Teaching Department of Law, Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University (RTMNU), Nagpur, conducted National Webinar on Issues and Challenges of Data Protection on 13th day of February 2023 in a virtual mode on Cisco Webex platform.

The eminent resource person who enlightened the webinar was, Vijayashankar NagarajaRao (Naavi)

The webinar was elated with the spotlight on the topic of Issues and Challenges of Data Protection in brief by Rudrakshi M. Mendhe, student of P.G.T.D.,Nagpur under the guidance of Mrs. Shikha Gupta, Teacher Co-ordinator, P.G.T.D.,Nagpur and a heartly welcome of our resource person by Dr. Payal Thaorey, Head of Department, Post Graduate Teaching Department of Law, Rashtrasant Tukdoji Maharaj Nagpur University(RTMNU), Nagpur.

In today's era Cyber Law and Data Protection is the emerging need as well as the prominent step towards its enhancement for the study of socio-legal issues.

Na. Vijayashankar, more popularly known as Naavi, is a pioneer in the field of Cyber Law in India, the eminent resource person of this national webinar beautifully he starts that "Talking about something which is not known by many or many are aware of; is the need of knowledge and the hour."

During the initial minutes Na. Vijayashankar, spoke about the two phases of Science and Data Protection and Objective of the specifically this National webinar. Firstly, he spoke about the discussions as well as New Bill of March regarding data protection which is a step towards advancement of knowledge into data protection and emerging socio-legal issues. Secondly, he spoke about the information privacy and a relevant judgement as stated in the case of Puttaswamy Judgement.

"Data Accumulates value as it transforms from one form to another. He exclaimed."

Nonetheless, Na. Vijayashankar widened his scope on data protection by highlighting on FDPPI, Puttaswamy Judgement on information protection and many. He also explored the students' knowledge by connecting the roots and history of data sciences and protection and laws. He told about the Panchatatva by Narayana Pandit and Hitwapadesh and Parvara and Hierarchy of Data Protection.

Further, Na. Vijayashankar explained beautifully the concept of Data Protection, its challenges in 20th century as well as how things actually happens and that, the value of data belongs to the person who created the given state of the Data. He glorified in this National webinar on the case of Puttaswamy Judgement thoroughly.

During this national webinar students were glorified under the words of Na. Vijayashankar and students also asked many questions regarding the same, which were calmly answered by Na. Vijayashankar.

The webinar ended with a vote of thanks with the short on the Issues and Challenges in the Data Protection by Dr. Girish Kulkarni, faculty of P.G.T.Dept. of Law, RTMNU's, Nagpur.

Data Protection refers to the set of privacy laws, policies and procedures that aim to minimize intrusion into one's privacy caused by the collection, storage and dissemination of personal data. Personal data generally refers to the information or data which relate to a person who can be identified from that information or data whether collected by any Government or any private organization or an agency.

The Constitution of India does not patently grant the fundamental right to privacy. However, the courts have read the right to privacy into the other existing fundamental rights, ie, freedom of speech and expression under Art 19(1)(a) and right to life and personal liberty under Art 21 of the Constitution of India. However, these Fundamental Rights under the Constitution of India are subject to reasonable restrictions given under Art 19(2) of the Constitution that may be imposed by the State. Recently, in the landmark case of Justice K S Puttaswamy (Retd.) & Anr. vs. Union of India and Ors., the constitution bench of the Hon'ble Supreme Court has held Right to Privacy as a fundamental right, subject to certain reasonable restrictions.

India presently does not have any express legislation governing data protection or privacy. However, the relevant laws in India dealing with data protection are the Information Technology Act, 2000 and the (Indian) Contract Act, 1872. A codified law on the subject of data protection is likely to be introduced in India in the near future. The (Indian) Information Technology Act, 2000 deals with the issues relating to payment of compensation (Civil) and punishment (Criminal) in case of wrongful disclosure and misuse of personal data and violation of contractual terms in respect of personal data.

Under section 43A of the (Indian) Information Technology Act, 2000, a body corporate who is possessing, dealing or handling any sensitive personal data or information, and is negligent in implementing and maintaining reasonable security practices resulting in wrongful loss or wrongful gain to any person, then such body corporate may be held liable to pay damages to

the person so affected. It is important to note that there is no upper limit specified for the compensation that can be claimed by the affected party in such circumstances.

An event like national webinar won't happen overnight, the staff works on it weeks ago and so did our department staff and student co-ordinators. We are thankful to be backed up by such hardworking team of department of law, who always encourage and enlightens the students with such emerging topics in today's era.

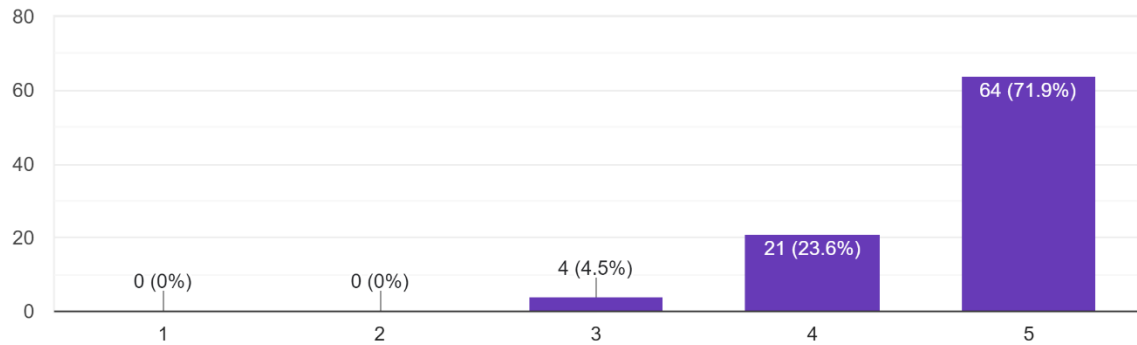

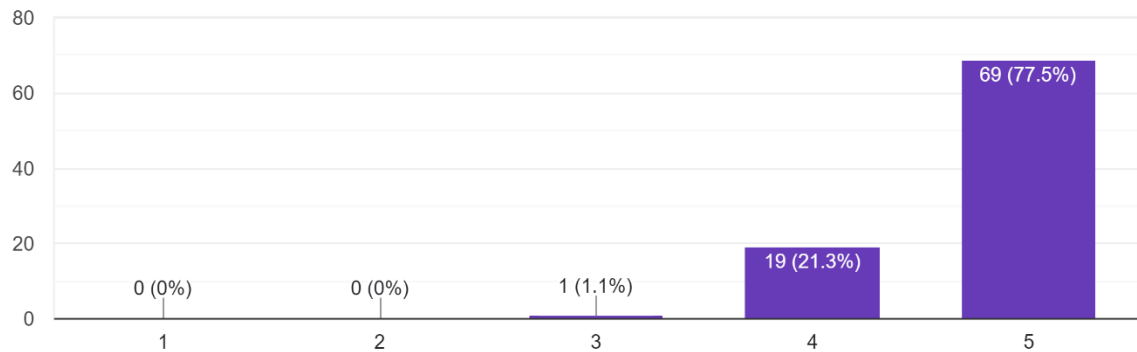

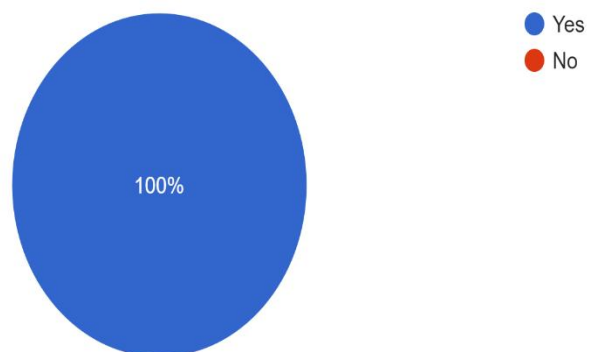
