Ms. Padama Ghatame, faculty member announced information related to the assignments and other parameters of the Pre-Ph.D. Course work.

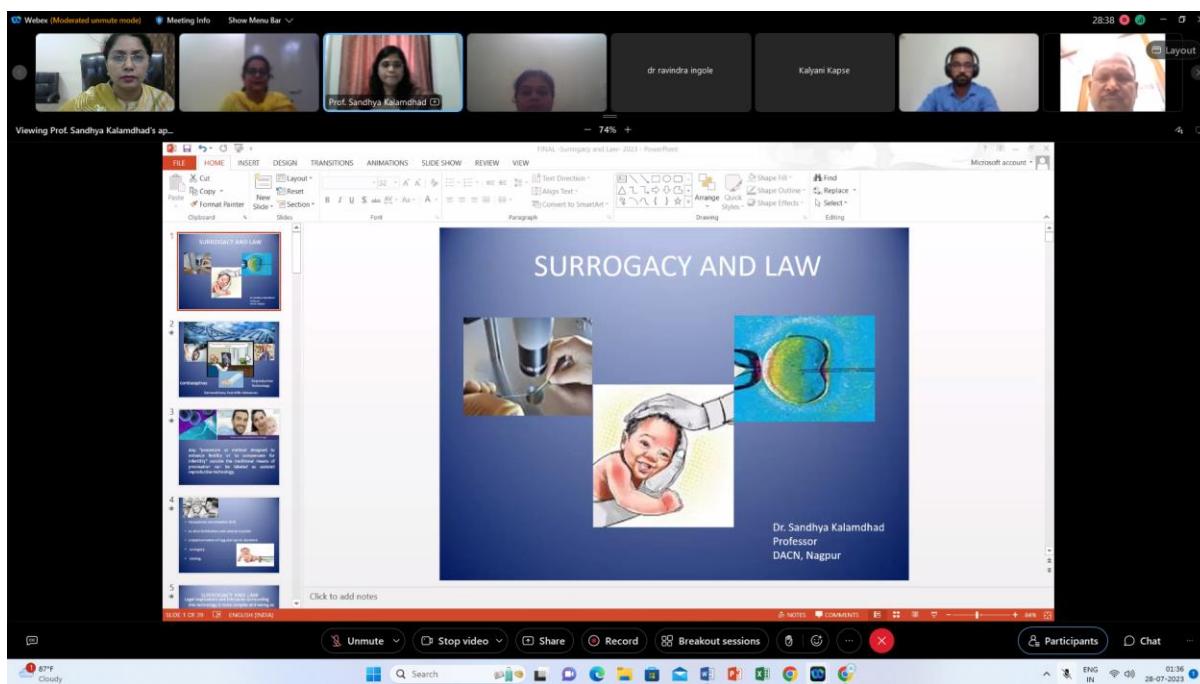

The first session for the day were taken by Dr. Mrs. Sandhya Kalamdhad on the topic "**Surrogacy and the law**". In this session, she threw a light upon the concept of surrogacy, the different types of assisted reproductive technologies that are available, the legal implications that the process of surrogacy leads to and lastly upon the Surrogacy Act, 2021. Respected madam commenced on a note when there were no laws to govern the surrogacy in India and thoroughly explained why the

need for having a legislation was felt in India. She discussed the various case laws from the arena in which the issues like abandonment of the child, opting of surrogacy by foreign nationals and its implications were discussed. She explained the salient features of the Surrogacy Act, 2021 and explained how the Act is failing short is not a comprehensive piece of legislation. She also put forth the debate in favour of a stronger legislation governing surrogacy in India and how the present Act is biased towards a number of categories of people from opting for surrogacy. Lastly, madam took a short question and answer session.



The **Second and Third session** had started by the research scholar Ms. Gayatri R. Diwe by introducing the esteemed guest **Dr. Ashok Bagul** who delivered a lecture upon “Cyber-crime – Recent trends in Investigation”. The session commenced at 4:00 pm and ended at 5:00 pm. In this session, sir introduced the research scholars to the various types of cyber-crime. He provided very hands on examples in order to make the session an interesting one for the scholars. Sir portrayed how the computers and internet medium are being used to dupe unaware people and commit a fraud upon them either of a financial or a personal nature. Ma'am highlighted how code has been helpful and has promoted entrepreneurship. She gave an example of Moser Baer (CD's and Pen drives) that due to change in technology the company went into bankruptcy. She explained the entire procedure of the Code in detail step wise that when do we file an application and appointment of interim resolution professional and what are the duties of IP. She further explained on moratorium period and how during this period all civil proceedings are stalled against the company.

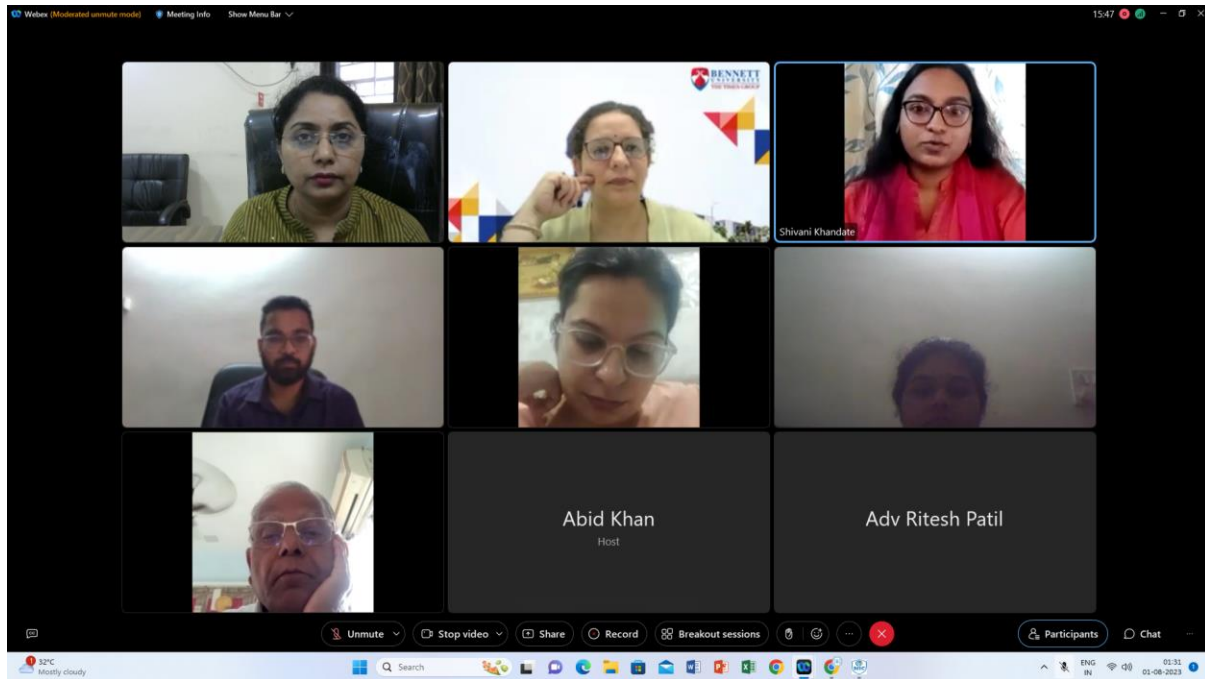

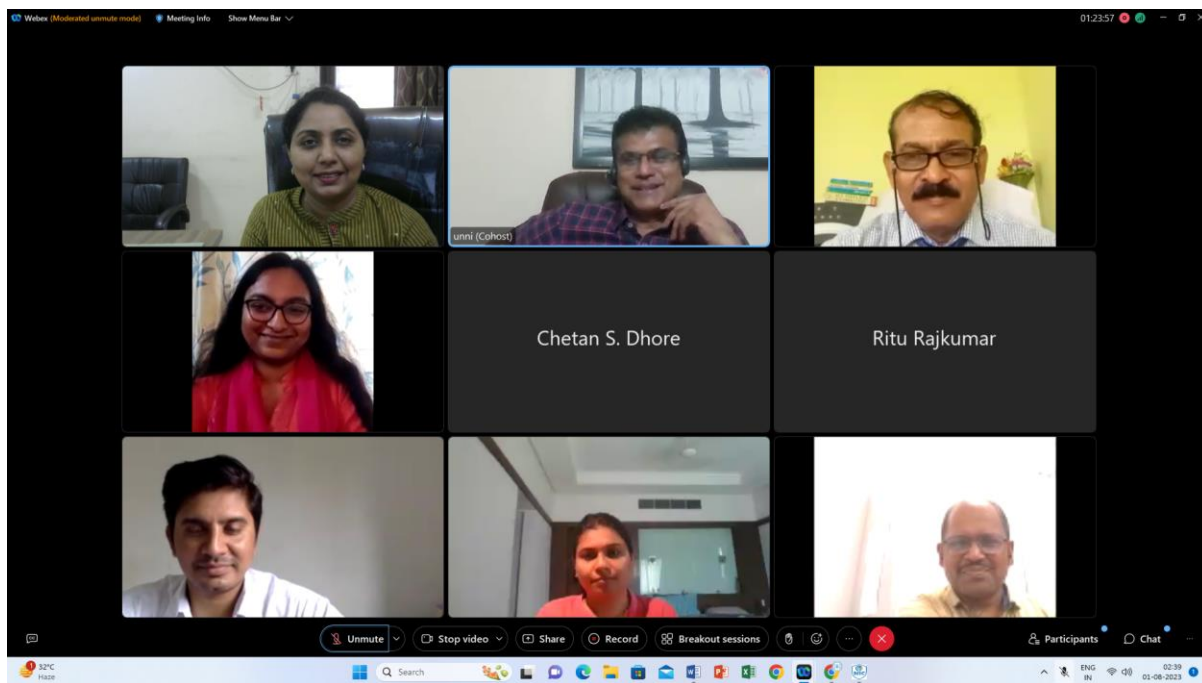

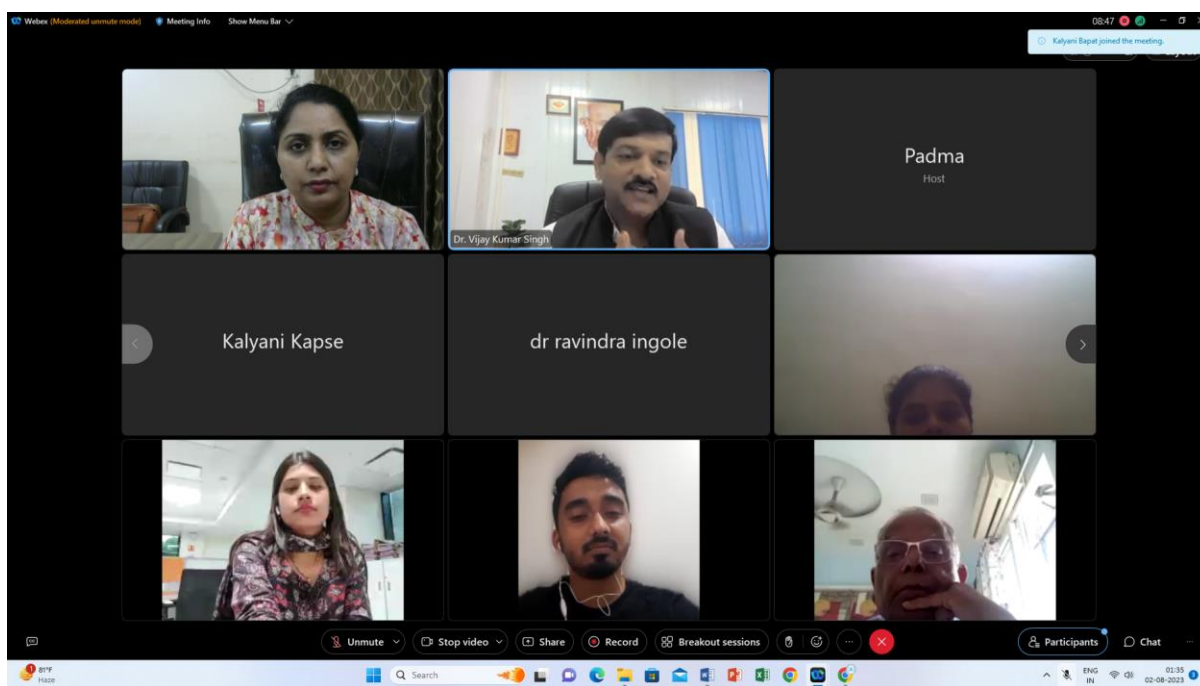
#### **Day: 8 (02/08/2023)**

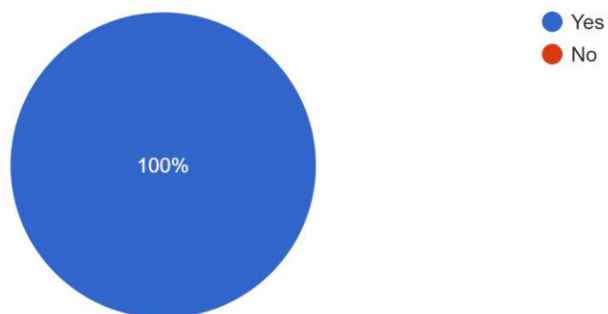

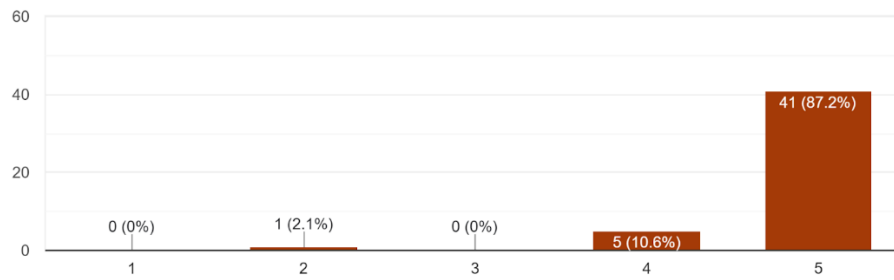

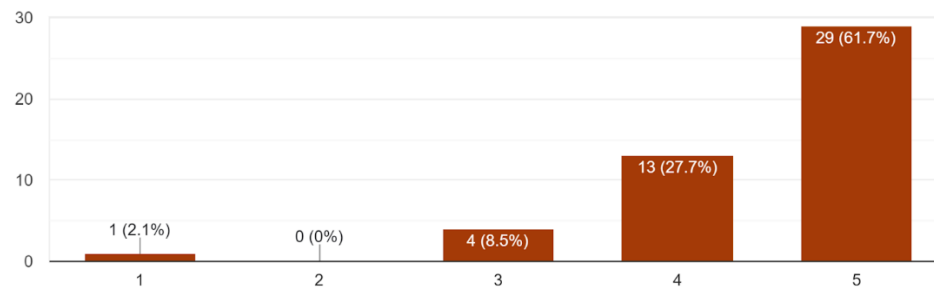

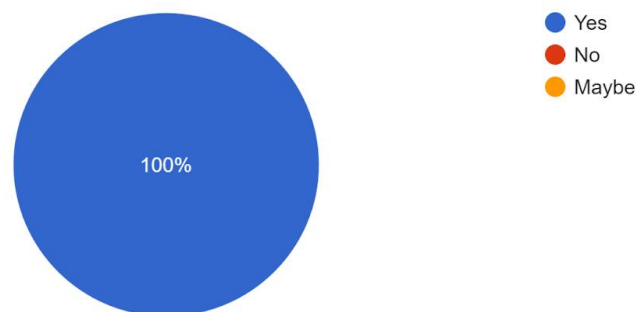

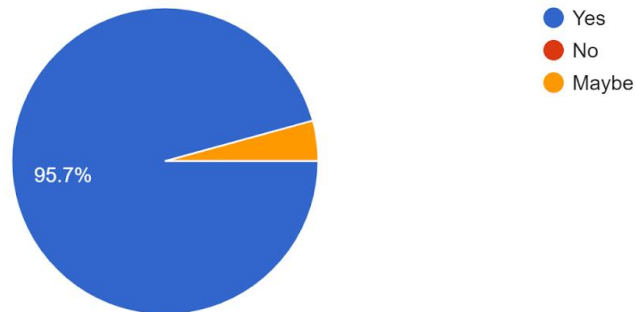

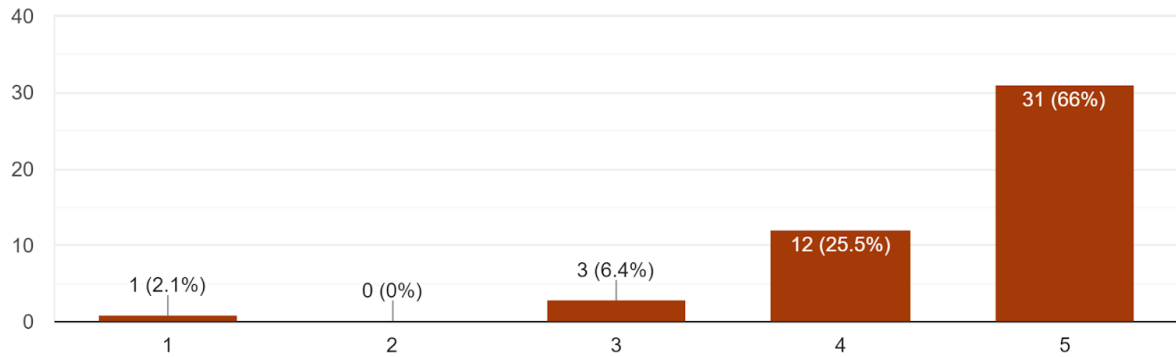

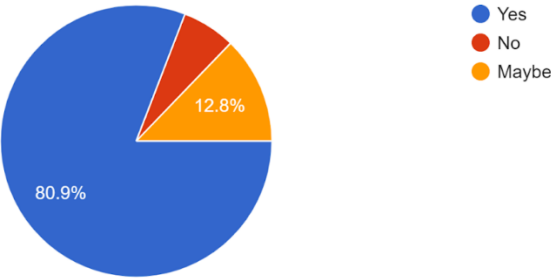

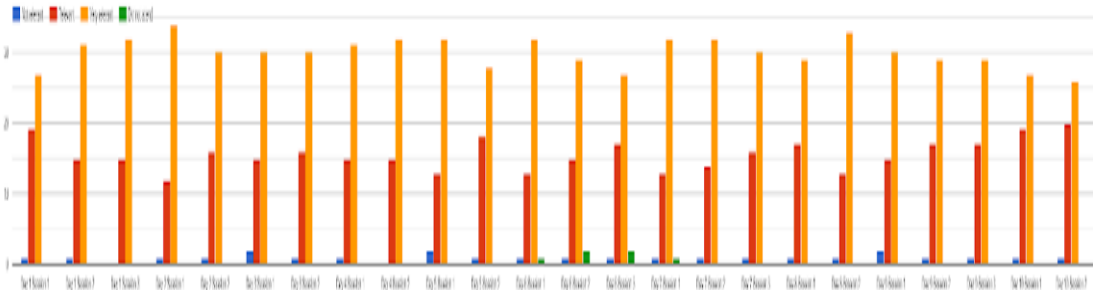

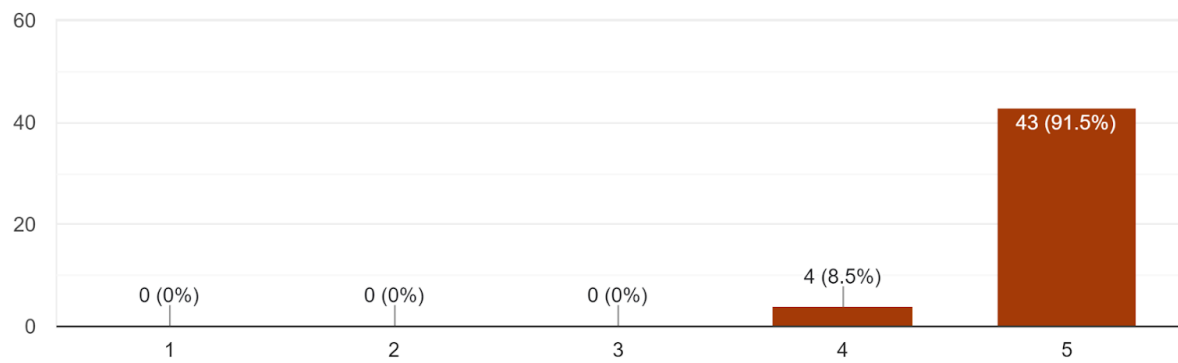
