Sub: Regulations und r section 26(i)(e) of the UGC Act defining the qualifications that should ordinarily be required of any person to be appointed to the traching staff of the Univ.

Sir,

I am directed to say that in exercise of the powers convered by clause (a) of Sub-section 1 of the section 26 with section 14 of the University Grants commission Act, 1956 (3 of 1956), the University Grants Commission has since framed regulations defining the qualifications that should ordinarily be required of any person to be appointed to the teaching staff of the University A copy of the Regulations framed by the Commission in this regard is enclosed. The University is requested to adopt the Regulations in the Statutes/Ordinances as may be considered necessary.

These regulations would come into effect from Ist July, 1983.

I am further to say that failure of the University to comply with the above Regulations would attract the provision containg in Section 14 of the UGC Act which is re-produced below:-

"If any University fails within a reasonable time to comply with any recommendation made by the Commission under Section 12 or Section 13 or contravenes the provisions of any rules made under clause (f) or clause (g) or sub-section (2) or Section 25, or of any regulation made under clause (e) or clause (f) or clause (g) of Section 26, the Commission, after taking into consideration the cause, if any, shown by the University for such failure or contrevention with such recommendation, may withold from the University the grant proposed to be made out of the Fund of the Commission.

The receipt of this latter may kindly be acknowledged and action taken by the University in this regard intimated to the Commission as early as possible.

NOT IF ICAT ION

In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (e) of subsection (1) of Section 26 read with section 14 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 (3 of 1956), the University Grants Commission makes the following regulations, namely:-

- 1. Short title, application and commencement:-
 - (i) These regulations may be called the University Grants Commission (Qualifications required of a person to be appointed to the teaching staff of a university or other institutions affiliated to it) Regulations, 1982.
 - (ii) They shall apply to every University established or incorporated by or under a Central Act, Provincial Act or a State Act, every institution including a constituent or an affiliated college recognised by the Commission, in consultation with the University concerned, under clause (f) or section 2 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 and every institution decard to be a university under section 3 of the seid Act.
 - (iii) They shall come into force on the date of the issue of this notification.

2. QUALIFICATIONS:_

No person shall be appointed to a teaching post in a university or in any of institutions including constitutent or affiliated colleges recognised under clause (f) of section 2 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 or in an institution deemed to be a university under section 3 of the said Act in a subject if he does not fulfil the requirements as to the qualifications for the appropriate subject as provided in schedule I to X of these regulations,

Provided that any relexation in the prescribed qualifications can only be made by a University in regard to the posts under it or any of the institutions including constituent or affiliated colleges a cognised under clause (f) of section 2 of the aforesaid Act or by an institution deemed to be university under section 3 of the said Act with the prior approval of the University Grants Commission.

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NOTE: Attention is invited to Section 14 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1936 which reads as follows:-

14. "If any University fails within a reasonable time to comply with any recommendation made by the Commission under section 12 or suction 13, or contravenos the provisions of any rule made under clause(f) or clause(g) of sub-section (2) of section 25 or of any regulation made under clause(g) of section 26, the Commission after taking into consideration the cause, if any, shown by the University for such failure or contravention, may withold from the University the grants proposed to be made out of the Fund of the Commission."

Consequences of failure of Jniversities to comply with recommendations of the Commission. Minimum qualifications for appointment to the posts of Professors and Readers in the Februaries of Arts, acting Social Science, Commerce and Panagement Studies.

PROFESSOR

An eminent scholar with published work of high quality actively engaged in research. About ten year's experience of teaching and/or research. Experience of guiding research at doctoral level.

OR

An outstanding scholar with established reputation who has made significant contribution to knowledge.

READER

Good academic record with a doctoral degree or equivalent published work. Evidence of being accively engaged in (i) research or (ii) innovation in teaching methods or (iii) production of teaching meterials.

About five year's evolutions of teaching and/or research provided that at least three or those years were as Secturar or in an equivalent position.

This condition may be relaxed in the case of candidates with outstanding record of Teaching/Research.

EXPULNATION

For determining "Good Academic Record" the following criteria shall be adopted:-

UNIVERSHITY READER:

- (i) A candidate holding a Ph.D. degree should possess atleast a second class destar's degree; or
- (ii) A candidate without a Ph.D. degree should possess a high second class tester's degree and second class in the Bechalor's degree;

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(iii) A candidate not possessing Ph.D. degree but possessing second class Aester's degree should have obtained first class in the Bachelor's degree.

Minimum qualifications prescribed for appointment to the post of Lecturers.

UNIVERSITY LECTURERS:

(i) Good Academic Record with atlast second class Master's degree in the subject(Mass Communication/Communication/Journalism, etc.) from an Indian University or an equivalent degree from a foreign university*.

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Atleast second class (C in the seven point scale) Master's degree in Social Sciences/ sciences/Humanities with at least a second class Bachelor's legrae or Diploma in Journalism from a recognised Indian Univ./ Post-graduate diploma from a processed National Institute.

Dasirable:

Minimum qualifications for Lecturers in the Department/Faculties of Management Studies.

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LECTURER:

A Master's degree in Business Administration or M.Tech. in Engineering with first class with the provision that the incumbent would acquire a doctorate degree within a period of eight years.

In the case of allied subjects like Industrial Psychology Personnel, Management, Business Statistics, Costs Accountancy etc. where Lecturers are required to be recruited with qualifications other than M.B.A. or M.Tech., the minimum qualifications shall be the same as prescribed under Schedule-I for in Faculties or Arts, Social Sciences including Commerce and Sciences.

Minimum qualifications for appointment to the posts of Lecturers in Departments/Faculties in Law in the Universities and Colleges.

L.L.M. Degree with Good Academic Record.

These qualifications may not be insisted upon where a Note: University appoints practising advocate at part-time lecturers.

EXPLANAT ION:

For determining "good academic record" the following criteria shall be adopted:

- A candidate holding a Ph.D. degree should possess (i) atleast second class Master's degree ; or
- A candidate without a Ph.D. degree should possess a (ii) High second class Master's degree and second class in the Bachelor's degree ; or
- (iii) A candidate not possessing Ph.D. degree but possessing second class Master's degree should have obtained first Class in the Bachelor's degree.

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
